

FULL-TIME TRAINING IN LONDON (FTTL) CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

December 2025

The FTTL Bower estate construction is planned for two phases:

The first phase is the main building needed for the training classes as well as kitchen and dining facilities for the trainees, for the larger gatherings of the saints (at least 900 potentially), and for the packing and shipping of the ministry, especially the New Testament Recovery Version, to many parts of Europe. Work resumed on this building in March of this year, about fifteen months after it was halted due to lack of funds. As of this week, during this year we will have received about 40% of the total needed for this first phase. We expect the amount needed to reach completion to be no more than 10 million dollars and hope to finish in time for the beginning of the August 2028 term of FTTL, if not sooner.

The second phase is the complete renovation of the farm buildings on Bower Farm, adjacent to Bower House. We hope to bring our capacity up to at least 200 trainees being housed on the Bower estate. Therefore, for this second phase, we hope that many saints would come as volunteers to help in the building of the lodging places for the trainees, thus reducing the overall costs.

At present we will put nearly all our current construction efforts toward the main structure since it is already needed for classroom and dining space. Our present classroom and dining training facilities are already full. Following the training building's completion, we will focus on the new housing arrangements at Bower Farm. This can be done in segments over an extended period of time as the training grows.
